- Table showing department fire responses by category, by Aldermanic District, with explanatory key describing the type and number of equipment assigned at various alarm levels.


It is my intent to keep you apprised of the information listed above in my quarterly review. If you have any questions regarding the enclosed information, please call me directly.















ALS = Advanced Life Support (life threatening emergency medical response requires MED units)

BLS = Basic Life Support (non-life threatening emergency medical response handled with rig)

FIRE = structure fires (all alarm types 1-5), appliance fire, auto fire, garage fire, grass fire, pole fire, rubbish fire, smoke at night, smoke condition, tree fire

PVT = Private Ambulance Service Providers

RESCUE = alarm soundings, auto accident w/multiple injuries, auto extrication, carbon monoxide, elevator stuck, HAZMat-HURT-BOAT-DIVE team responses, wires down, suspicious calls, electrical trouble emergency response, forceable entry

SERVICE = building inspection, firefighter assistance, FLUSH, heating trouble, lock out, MFD accident, mutual aid, petroleum spill, pre-fire plan, special events, water leaks, unknown
