RE: LEAVE OF ABSENCE EXTENSION

Dear Commissioners:

This correspondence is to inform you that pursuant to City Service Rules, I have approved an extension to the educational leave of absence without pay for Police Officer Matthew Curler. A copy of Officer Curler's request for an extension to his educational leave of absence is attached for reference, along with the correspondence I sent him informing him that I have approved his request, subject to various terms and conditions. His leave of absence will commence February 2, 2012, and expire February 2, 2013. The purpose of Officer Curler's leave (as stated in his request) is to continuing pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Requests for unpaid educational leaves of absence are evaluated on a case-by-case basis. They are not to be construed as being precedential in any respect. In his request for his educational leave, Officer Curler indicates his coursework would prove beneficial throughout the progression of his career with the Milwaukee Police Department and his goal to become a supervisor.
