## Parole Hearing For Convicted Cop Killer Topic Of 2 P.M. News Conference

The murder of a Milwaukee police officer more than 33 years ago is still fresh in the memories of those who served with him, and officers too young to have known him honor his memory.

One of the men convicted in the bar shooting of **Police Officer Ronald Reagan** in December 1973 will soon have a parole hearing, and **Ald. Bob Donovan** will join members of **the Milwaukee Police Association** during a news conference at 2 p.m. **TODAY (Monday, March 26, 2007)** to discuss the matter.

The news conference is being held outside the **Felmers O. Chaney Correctional Center, 2825 N. 30<sup>th</sup> St.**

According to news reports, **Officer Reagan** was off duty when he stopped at a tavern, the Bungalow Tap, 2943 W. Hadley St. Three men with guns came in and announced a robbery. One held the barrel against the head of a patron. When Officer Reagan drew his weapon to thwart the robbers, the men started shooting.

The officer – married with two children – was hit by six bullets. The killers ran away with no money, but police later arrested three men, and all three received life sentences. One of the men – **Kenneth Jordan** – is scheduled for a parole hearing sometime next month.
