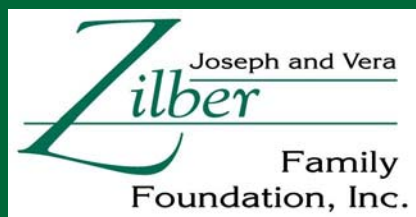

Venues for Prosperity

Homes in the Lindsay Heights neighborhood are being restored thanks to many supporters including Wells Fargo and the City of Milwaukee Department of City Development- Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP). Walnut Way has acquired and started renovating 8 units on N. 16th Street.

NSP Programs include a Homebuyer Assistance Program that helps prospective homeowners purchase and rehabilitate foreclosed homes they will occupy as their primary residence; Buy in Your Neighborhood Program that helps homeowners buy a foreclosed property within three blocks of where they live for rental purposes; and Rental Rehabilitation Program that helps responsible landlords purchase and rehabilitate foreclosed homes for affordable rental opportunities. Environmental Stewardship

The Walnut Way Center located at 2240 North 17th Street continues to be an active place for neighborhood engagement and demonstration. In addition to accommodating the many community meetings and educational events such as our 4H Club, Gardens to Market Program and Health Advocates, the Center is also a space for educational tours. All kinds of people visit Walnut Way to learn about neighborhood revitalization techniques, urban agriculture, healthy living and so much more. Recently, the Walnut Way Center was featured as a Mobile Learning Lab for the Neighborworks® national conference. Visitors from as far away as Georgia, California and Hawaii came to learn about our ways of sustaining a peaceful and nurturing environment.

Local schools also visit to learn about growing vegetables and beekeeping. This summer we were happy accommodate over 200 children from nearby schools. Children smelled herbs, watched insects and ate tomatoes right from the garden.

Lindsay Heights Neighborhood Health Alliance (LHNHA)

July 17th marked the beginning of the LHNHA Neighbor to Neighbor (N2N): Health Advocates Program. 11 neighbor-participants attended 6 health topic presentations, 4 healthy activity sessions (gardening and cooking included), taught a course to a neighbor, and recruited neighbors to join the next cohort of Health Advocates. The program is funded by the Healthy Wisconsin Partnership Program through the Medical College of Wisconsin.

Program objectives include improving access to food, building skills for cooking and preparing healthy meals, and creating opportunities for safe physical activity and health education. Health Advocates promoted healthy choices and self-responsibility. Participants came to understand the outcomes of living a healthy lifestyle. Health presentation topics included: Heart Disease Prevention and Heart Healthy Meals, Diabetes and Weight Management Recipes, Cancer Prevention and much more. The sessions were in tandem with Fondy Food Center's Community Food Specialist, Kimberly Njoroge. A seasoned cook herself, she taught classes on the preparation and storage of healthy meals, their nutritional values and using local foods.

October 23rd marked our last day with the first graduates of the Health Advocates Program. Advocates were acknowledged with Certificates of Completion. Following the commencement ceremony, the LHNHA quarterly community meeting began. Here folks gather to work toward eliminating health disparities. One man attending the ceremony said, "this is Milwaukee's best kept secret."
